



Saint Padre Pio's feast day is Monday, September 23.



Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, widely known as Padre Pio, was an Italian Capuchin friar, priest, stigmatist, and mystic. He was born on May 25, 1887. He died on September 23, 1968, and was canonized by Pope John Paul II on June 16, 2002. Just before he died, Padre received a message from Jesus. "My son," Jesus said to him, "do not think that my agony lasted three hours. No, on account of the souls who have received most from me, I shall be in agony until the end of the world." Padre Pio's last words, with his rosary in hand were, "Gesu, Maria"

(Jesus, Mary)." At 2:30 a.m., he died in his cell in San Giovanni Rotondo.

He live an extraordinary life and reached the very heights of holiness. He bore the wounds of Christ in his own flesh for 50 years until his final hours when the stigmata completely disappeared without a scar. His life is a testament to perseverance and wisdom. He is also known for his sense of humor and his many inspiring sayings.

Ministry Corner by Deb Steinbacher

October is rapidly approaching, and along with all the fall festivities, it is Respect life Month beginning with Respect Life Sunday on the 6th. The Bishops have placed a great deal of focus on the Eucharist. The connection to Respect Life month is reflected in our belief that He is present in the Eucharist, and in our acceptance that He came for us all to have life. St. John Paul II wrote that "we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between...the culture of death and the culture of life...with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life."

Sadly the slippery slope that began in 1973 with the legalization of abortion has led to an acceptance of euthanasia and physicianassisted suicide as more and more people buy into the thought that they have a "right" to decide what they can do with their own bodies. But we forget. The bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit and not our own (1 Cor. 6:19). When we do our own choosing, we need to remember this and that the culture of death does not glorify God. As St. Paul admonished, "For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore, glorify God in your body." (1Cor. 6:20).

God help us as we choose to promote the culture of life!
