Blessings of Backpacks

Father Mike will be blessing backpacks at all Masses this weekend, August 17/18.

Lets get ready for an exciting new Religious Education year! We want to encourage our children with the promises of God and surround them with the love of their parents and parish community as they prepare for another school year.

Classes begin on September 22 at 9:00 a.m. for Grades 1-8.

First Holy Communion is a two year program. Class attendance for first and second grade is needed to meet the Diocesan requirements to receive this Sacrament.

Confirmation is a two year program. Class attendance for seventh and eighth grade is needed to meet the Diocesan requirements to receive this Sacrament.

OCIA (Formerly RCIA)

Are you or anyone you know interested in becoming Catholic?

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly "Rite of...") is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic Christians and receive the sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Order speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey".

Who is OCIA for? Briefly, for 1) Persons in need of Baptism 2) Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic. 3) Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

If you know of any person who has shared an interest or curiosity about Catholic faith and would like to learn more by participating in the OCIA program, sessions will begin September 9, (place to be announced). Please call Susie Mann, OCIA parish leader, at 570-244-8133 for more information.


