"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."



Dear Parish Family and Friends,

It has been a few weeks since I have had a letter in the bulletin. I had a wonderful time visiting my sister and her family in West Virginia. She is such a beautiful soul, a loving mother and

grandmother, and the best baby sister ever. However, there is truly no place like home, with my Church Family. I want to thank you once again for your tremendous generosity to Greg Fleck and to our missionary Priest, Fr. Neftali. Christ Jesus calls us to help one another, especially those most in need. Well done, good and faithful servants.

In addition to following Christ by loving our neighbors and serving the poor, we are called to receive in Holy Communion, His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, by eating His Body and drinking His Blood. As we read in this 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of the Gospel of John, many found this saying too hard and left Him. The Apostles responded with the words that both haunt and inspire me: *To whom shall we go?* You have the words of eternal life.

These words haunt me for two reasons. The first reason is that I pray constantly, daily, that you all will remain steadfast and strong when things are difficult in your lives. Terrible tragedy, severe illness, chronic conditions, family struggles, and the loss of loved ones are times when many struggle with their faith. Some lose or give up on their faith. Some are angry with God. As priests of God, we truly suffer for you in times like that. I often feel quite powerless because I cannot change the situation. All I can do is pray, and if you want me present, I will do all that I can to be there. I'm far from perfect. I often fail in these regards when I am overwhelmed with parish life and responsibilities, but my heart and prayers are always there. I'm not the answer—Jesus is.

The other reason those words, "to who shall we go" haunt me is that I wonder if I will always be strong enough to follow the Lord in the face of personal failures, extreme hardships, or persecutions. Will I leave Him if things get too scary? Will I deny Him if faced with death? I hope not. Please pray for me and all priests, that we will always remain steadfast and true to God's Holy Word as we follow His Son, especially in the face of martyrdom—red or white.

With those two concerns out of the way, these words also give me extraordinary strength and hope. We do, indeed know the Way! He is the Way the Truth and the Life. We no longer are searching for help and meaning. We have found it in Him, The Living Bread Who came down from Heaven. Let us rejoice as we eat His Body and Drink His Blood in the Blessed Sacrament of Holy Communion. Let us give thanks as we celebrate this Eucharist, the sacrifice of the Holy Mass, where once again He gives Himself to us! ...Don't need to go anywhere else!

Classes begin on September 22, at 9:00 a.m. for Grades 1-8.




*First Holy Communion* is a two year program. Class attendance for first and second grade is needed to meet the Diocesan requirements to receive this Sacrament.


