This Sunday is the last regular Sunday of Ordinary Time for the Church year. Next Sunday will be the feast of Christ the King, and the following Sunday will be the First Week of Advent...then...yikes...Christmas! For our Church calendar, Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year. I mention this to give a context for our Old Testament and Gospel readings this

I want to do all that I can to prepare my soul, and all that I can to prepare your souls for that inevitable reality. We offer several scheduled opportunities for Confession, but I am willing to hear private confessions whenever we can get together. It is that important.
