

The Month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Last Sunday I had the joy of celebrating the Sacrament of Baptism for Easton Daniel Forrestal, the precious child of Luke and Gabrielle. Baptism is one of the most joyful aspects of being a priest. Welcome to our parish family, little Easton! I feel like I am giving all that the Lord has given me, everything that has meaning, when I baptize someone.

The reading about the poor widow who gave all that she had to the Lord sparks memories of two foundational experiences in my life and my vocation. If I have already shared the first experience, please forgive me. I'm at that stage in life where I often repeat myself.

The first experience that the generosity of the poor woman calls to my mind a dear elderly (to my 6 year old mind) woman who sent over a basket of food to my Mother every week. My birth father had left us. We got by only due to my Grandmother Isabel and the help of neighbors. One of those neighbors was "old" Mrs. Woods. This was back in the early 60's. My mother had a job at the pajama factory which didn't pay enough to cover both rent and feeding her two children. However, we never went hungry because of Isabel and Mrs. Woods. I knew, even then, that this was a blessing that I wanted to be able to share with someone in need when I grew up. I truly believe that this was part of what formed me and caused me to be open to the Priesthood.

The second, equally important experience in my ongoing formation as a Priest, took place the year after I was ordained. Grandma Isabel and I went to Italy to visit family. It was the first time that we had spent any length of time together as adults. At one point I asked Isabel if she remembered that rich woman who always sent us food. She asked if I meant Mrs. Woods. When I said yes, she said, "Mrs. Woods wasn't rich at all. In fact, she was really poor since her husband had died years before." I was not only surprised, but I was filled with a new sense of gratitude and a deeper respect for my poor widow, who fed us not out of her wealth. It may have been liver, powdered milk and sugar pops each week, but from her poverty she taught generosity, human and divine.
